

Town Council Update

The Council passed a resolution authorizing an Intergovernmental agreement between the Yemassee Police Department and the Ridgeland Police Department. This agreement aimed to facilitate mutual support and cooperation between the two departments during natural disasters, disorderly situations, special events, emergencies, and other law enforcement activities.

Town Council officially appointed Garey L. Gibbs to the Zoning Board of Appeals, effective immediately. Gibbs replaced Stefania McDaniel in this vital role, bringing his expertise and contributions to the board.

Additionally, the Council approved the Rules of Procedures submitted by the newly formed Planning Commission. This endorsement ensured the commission could effectively carry out its responsibilities while adhering to established guidelines and protocols.

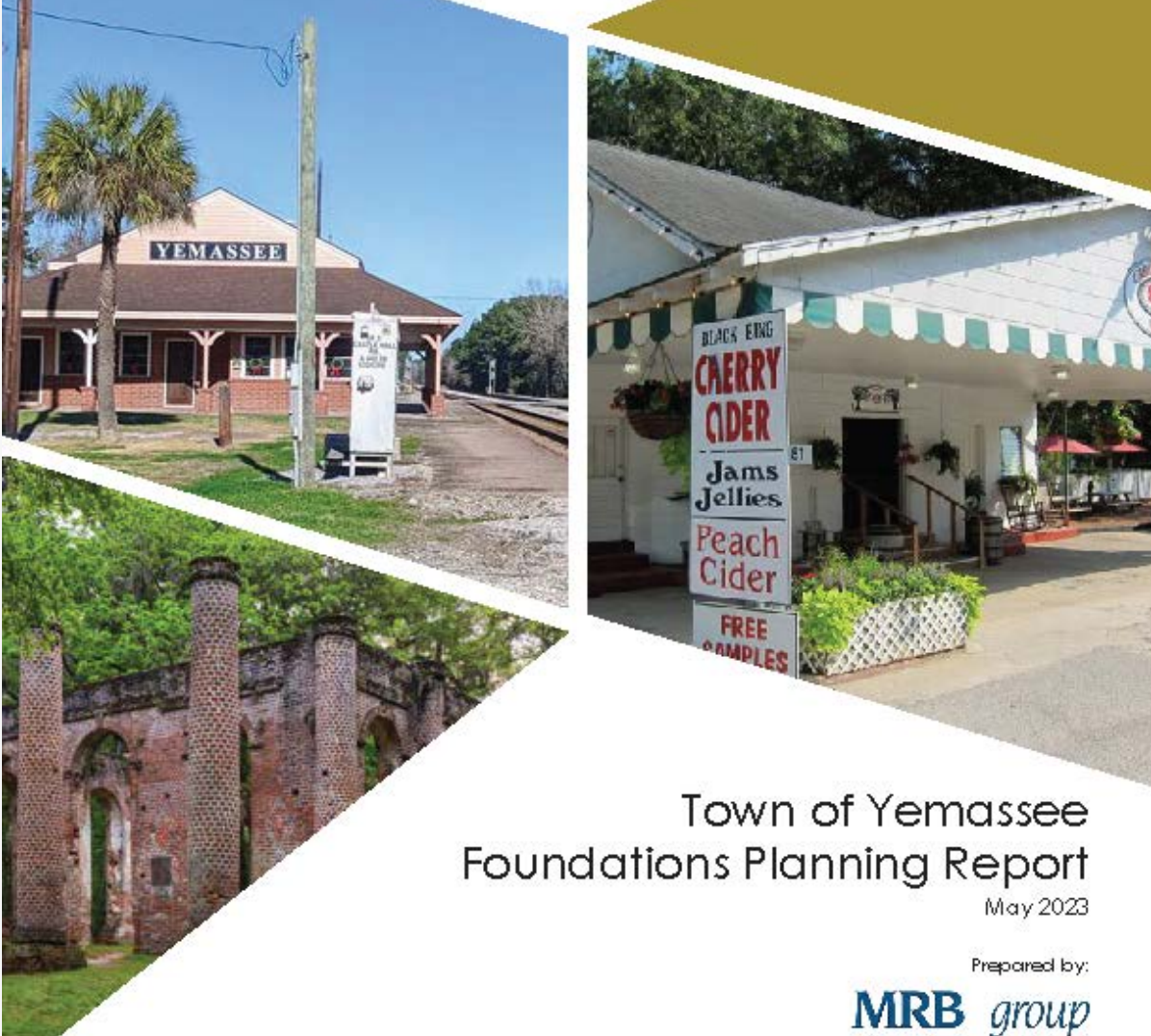

Thank you, Councilwoman Stacy Pinckney and Councilman David Paul Murray, for being a part of Team Yemassee.

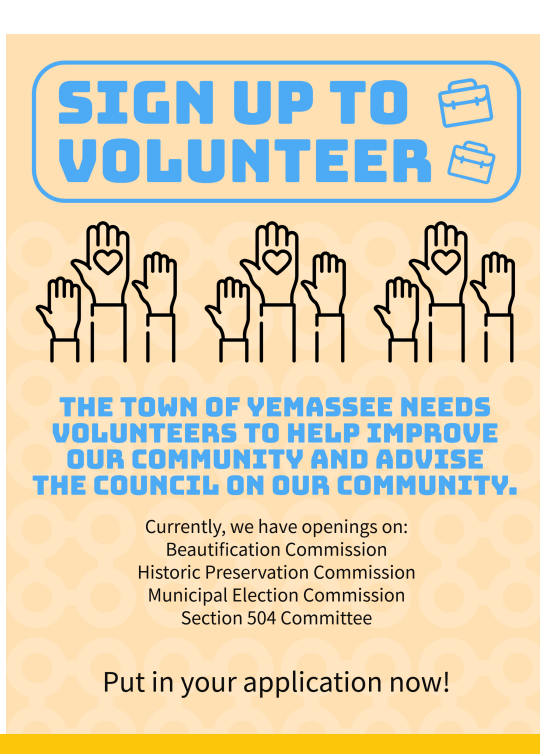
